PRIOR AUTHORIZATION CRITERIA

(May be considered medically necessary when criteria I through III are met):

- I. Patient has documented diagnosis of episodic migraine headaches (4-14 migraine days per month) or chronic migraines (15 or more headache days per month with at least 8 migraine days per month)
- II. Documentation that patient has tried and failed or cannot tolerate ALL of the medication options A through C below for prevention of episodic or chronic migraine headaches
 - A. Divalproex Sodium or Topiramate
 - B. Metoprolol or propranolol
 - C. Venlafaxine or Amitriptyline
- III. Documentation that evaluation has been performed demonstrating patient does not suffer from rebound headaches due to medication overuse (medication overuse headache, or MOH)

EXCLUSION CRITERIA

- N/A

OTHER CRITERIA

- N/A

QUANTITY / DAYS SUPPLY RESTRICTIONS

- ONE PACK of one autoinjector (70mg/1mL) OR ONE PACK of two autoinjectors (140mg/2mL) per 30 days

APPROVAL LENGTH

- **Authorization:** 6 months for first-time prescription then 1 year thereafter
- **Re-Authorization:** An updated letter of medical necessity or progress notes showing that current prior authorization criteria are met and that the medication is effective.
